

Pastor's Thoughts



[3] For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. [4] For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, [5] so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. [6] Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; [7] if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching; [8] the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads, with zeal; the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness. (Romans 12:3–8 ESV)

Take note of the context in which Paul grounds his teaching, in verses 3-5 we are "members" of "one body". The apostle wants the church to understand the importance of their "oneness". This unity is held together by two actions: the apostle calls church members to judge themselves soberly and have humility toward one another. It is also important to see that Paul acknowledges that it is God who "has assigned" to each member what they need to serve Him. It is hard to be dominerring over others or think better of one's self if we recognize that we are not at all responsible for that which the Lord God has bestowed upon us. However, as we move into verses 6-8, Paul does clearly communicate that the members of the church are responsible for using their "gifts".

God has gifted every believer to serve His church, His kingdom, and fulfill His plan. We recently held a spiritual gifts class to help members learn more about what the Bible teaches about gifting, and to get an idea of personal giftedness. Gathering all this information about gifts is great but if it never gets employed for God's Kingdom purpose then it is useless. While we are all a part of the church body, we all have a different position to play (connecting back to the baseball illustration). We are not all called to be teachers, prayer warriors, worship leaders, pastors, or ushers and that is okay. However, God has gifted you to serve in His church in a specific way, and at Bluff Hall as we serve we seek to "Share His Love". If you have the gift of hospitality, how can you share the love of Jesus with every person that comes through the doors of Bluff Hall, whether it is Sunday worship or a mid-week Bible Study? If you have the gift of service, how are you sharing the love of Jesus through your service? No matter what your giftedness, these are the kinds of questions you, as a committed follower of Christ, must seek to answer. The good news is that you do not have to do it alone! The church exists to help you use your gifts to make an impact for the glory of God. As you grow in Christ, look for ways you can "Share His Love" by serving God within the four walls of the church and in your community.

Highlights of April 10, 2024 Quarterly Meeting

Good attendance with 18 members present.

Treasurer Report: Checkbook balance is \$19,591.16, Memorial Fund balance \$13,780.70, Savings Account balance \$15,342.59, and \$75,000 in church fund CD and \$10,000 CD designated for Building Fund. 1st Quarter Income: \$27,024.00 (35% budget) and 1st Quarter Expenses were \$24,294.63 (28% of budget.

Deacons Report: Working on restarting Project Rejuvenation that was discussed several years ago, which evaluates current ministry with a vision plan for 5-10 years out. Working on a self-evaluation questionnaire for the Pastor.

Trustees Report: Recent meeting held to elect officers and divide into building & grounds and finance subgroups. Voted to put \$10,000 of building fund into CD seeing no immediate need for funds. Plaster in kitchen that was previously torn down is being repaired. Other needed improvements discussed. Outlet behind copier was requested to be replaced.

Women's Fellowship: Recently sponsored Family Fun Day and the Annual Cleaning Day. A Spring outing is being planned. The group has donated to Loaves and Fishes food pantry, purchased Easter lilies for shutins/elderly members, and purchased Starbuck gift cards to send to our college students for finals week. A new mixer and stainless-steel pot have been purchased for the kitchen.

Men's Fellowship: Recently met to elect officers. Ice Cream Social set for June 2 and committee formed.

Christian Ed & Sunday School: Children's and adult Sunday school continue. Easter egg hunt went well.

Cemetery Committee: Spring-cleaning of cemetery has been done. Thanks to those who helped.

Missions Committee: 5th Sunday donations collected. Dessert auction fundraiser went well. Recently sent \$600 semi-annual donation to Young Life and \$300 quarterly donation to Ahdee. New Start Rescue Mission recently requested \$500 and this was sent and \$500 was provided to Around the World EFC missions. Checkbook balance: \$4670. Members noted that Young Life is not as present in community as it once was; it was suggested Mary Fairchild check into how active they are.

Retreat House: No report other than \$300 annual fee has been sent.

Pastor's Report: A 6-week Mid-Week Bible study on 'Six Steps to Reading Your Bible' recently concluded and was well attended with positive comments from attendees. Spiritual Gifts class is scheduled for April 16 and A Study of Mark Mid-Week Bible Study will start April 30. Bibles for Baccalaureate have been ordered for approximately 30-32 Payson graduates. Pastor recently attended EFCA Pastor's meeting in Morton Illinois.

Old Business

Committee on Use of Church Facilities will meet soon.

New Business

Vacation Bible School is being planned with the Methodist Church. Bluff Hall is trying to have input. Only our budget amount will be contributed.

Livestream/Internet for church was discussed at length. Airwaves is not an option. Other options presented were HughesNet, Starlink, and Verizon Hotspot. Information about contract, taxes and additional fees, ongoing monthly cost, upfront equipment cost, and installation costs of each option was presented and discussed. A motion was made by Susan Humphrey to purchase Starlink satellite and mounting equipment needed for \$700 and pay the \$140.00 monthly fee for the rest of the calendar year using money from the Memorial Fund. Paul Miller seconded it. Motion carried. Pastor Richard, Barb Speckhart, and John Felten from trustees are to do a consultation call with Starlink.

Pastor Richard stated there are plans in the works to utilize Bluff Hall's one free use day at the Retreat House this year.

July Quarterly meeting was set for Wednesday, July 10 at 7 p.m.
